



On May 6, 2020, the Las Vegas City Council adopted a bill extending the temporary alcohol delivery license that was previously set to expire in June. The City Council voted to push the temporary license expiration date to January 1, 2021. The Nevada Restaurant Association considers this a big step toward assisting restaurants in recovering.

The official minutes from the Las Vegas City Council meeting read as follows, “Bill No. 2020-16 - For possible action - Authorizes the establishment of one or more temporary programs to allow certain types of businesses with an alcoholic beverage license and a restaurant license to offer and provide the delivery or the curbside pickup of alcoholic beverages in connection with the delivery or pickup of food by a customer who has placed an order therefor. Sponsored by: Councilman Brian Knudsen Motion made by Stavros Anthony to Approve as a First Amendment Passed For: 7; Against: 0; Abstain: 0; Did Not Vote: 0; Excused: 0”.
